Quick Facts About Blackfalds



The Town has grown by 180% since 2009, nearly doubling the population in 10 years with a population of 10,125 (2018 census).



Blackfalds has a base of young and growing families with 55% of the town population under the age of 40.



59% of the Town's residents have vocational training or secondary education.



Blackfalds offers 16 km of trails for use year round and the only indoor Trans Canada Trail inside the Abbey Centre.



BOLT - a regional partnership which offers daily transit service between Red Deer, Blackfalds, and Lacombe.

The Town of Blackfalds is one of Canada's fastest growing communities - with 10,125 residents - and a great place to live, work and do business.







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Economic Development

The Business Advantage in Blackfalds

Blackfalds continued to experience increased business activity in 2018. There was a 5% growth in the number of storefront shops and a 7% increase in the number of home-based businesses.

It was a busy year implementing new tools for business retention and attraction including a new Economic Development website that highlights the attractions for current and future businesses to invest in our Town.



Industrial Development

The Town experienced significant Industrial growth; doubling from 2016-2017 and 2017-2018.

Valley Ridge Industrial Park expanded with Castle Guard Storage and STEP Energy and 15 new units in Phase 3 of Garage World.



New Businesses

We welcomed new businesses to town including Rotor Tech Canada, PL Customz, Viva Deli, OK Tire, and Blackfalds Towing.



Commercial Development

After the boom in building in 2017, 2018 saw existing business expand and new businesses come to

town and occupy spaces in the new highway commercial and residential strip malls.

These included ATB, Pet-Valu, Kids 3 Daycare, Legacy Athletix, Petro-Canada, Aspen Lakes Child Care, Okinawa Sushi, and Black Diamond Nail Studio, and 35 new licensed local businesses.



Community Services

Recreation, Parks & Trails

As Blackfalds continues to grow, we always look to develop amenities that our residents will need and want in our community. With world class facilities like the Abbey Centre, Civic Cultural Centre, Community Centre and Multi-Plex Arena, Blackfalds continues to stay ahead of the curve.

This past year we expanded our offerings for user friendly, accessible recreation spaces including:

- Bike Skills Park
- Denise Nielsen Memorial Park
- Rolling Hills Playground
- Pine Crescent Outdoor Rink and skateboard structure



Other recreational amenities added in 2018:

- One (1) km of paved trail to existing trails
- Solar panel installation at Civic Centre
- Ball shelters installed at ball diamond #5 and at Cottonwood diamonds
- Trees added to Bark Park with assistance from Blackfalds Girl Guides Pathfinders program
- Lobby furniture and counters added to Arena lobby with thanks to the Blackfalds and District Agricultural Society
- Outdoor skating spaces throughout the community
- Expanded the Community Gardens program to two gardens and increased plots
- Light Up Blackfalds created by Parks staff continues to attract large number of spectators

FCSS priorities, directed by the 2016 Social Needs Assessment and Master Plan, support community agencies and organizations through annual grant funding and provide collaborative efforts to strengthen and enhance the quality of life for all Blackfalds residents.

A new Talk of the Town newsletter was launched that features a Mayor's Minute and Councillor's Corner and was mailed with the monthly utility bill.

New Program & Activity Guide

The new program & activity guide is published in March, August and November. It includes Town programs and events and features local businesses and non-profits.



Infrastructure and Property Services

Planning & Development

The Town of Blackfalds experienced a reduction in building permits in 2018 due to the economic conditions in Alberta. However, growth was still strong in Blackfalds compared to the rest of the province. Staff has been actively planning, implementing and communicating the Cannabis legislation and new requirements under the Municipal Government Act.

Cannabis in Blackfalds

The Town of Blackfalds worked on updating its bylaws to assist the Town in regulating Cannabis stores and use in accordance with Federal and Provincial regulations, including the Alberta Gaming, Liquor and Cannabis (AGLC) Regulations.

The new and amended legislation directly affect the Town of Blackfalds in three key areas:

- Land Use / Development
- Community Standards/Enforcement
- Social and Human Services

Infrastructure and Property Services

Infrastructure & Environmental Services

This department is made up of Public Works and office staff that keep Town services moving.

This includes construction of new services and ongoing operations and maintenance of roadways, sidewalks, water, sewer, stormwater, and environmental management.

Key projects in 2018



Construction of Highway 2A and Broadway Avenue realignment, traffic signals, and Tutty Pond improvements have been completed.



Grading of soccer field at All-Star Park.



North Red Deer Regional Wastewater System is in place and the Blackfalds' sewer system was approved to connect to the regional line.



South Street improvement west of Vista Trail have been completed.

Key Programs & Maintenance

- Spring and Fall large object recycling roundup.
- BOLT service changes included removing the Saturday service and added a late weekday evening run.
- Utility rates increased by 5% from 2017 with the regional sewer system coming online.
- The North Red Deer Regional Wastewater System substantially improves water quality returning to the Red Deer River. This system saved \$5 million in the immediate future and \$20 million over the next 20 years.
- Maintenance of 300 fire hydrants, 60 km of potable waterlines, 2 water reservoirs, 60 km of sewer lines, 5 lift stations, and 50 km of piping, drainage courses, and numerous stormwater ponds.
- Inspection and maintenance of 70 km of paved and gravel roadways, 140 km of sidewalks and trails.
