Dr. Kauchali has been a general practitioner for over 27 years, the last 12 of those were in Canada. He is currently practicing at the Apollo Health Centre and Delburne Medical Centre, and attends the Sylvan Lake Advanced Ambulatory Centre a couple days each month. He also routinely makes rounds in hospitals in the area, seeing patients that do not have family physicians.

The Apollo Health Centre team includes Naomi Birmingham, Dr. Kauchali's assistant who grew up in Alberta and received her physician assistant training in the USA. She will be assisting Dr. Kauchali, particularly with patients requesting female physicians. To round out the medical team at Apollo is medical office assistant Jill, receptionist Kylie, and office manager Rubina. clinic that uses the Medical Home platform which means we try to offer as many services as possible to our patients under one roof," he said, adding, "we would prefer to address your medical needs with our physicians than to send our patient somewhere else if possible."

The Apollo Health Centre will also serve as a walk-in clinic and offers same-day service for emergencies, and one day follow-ups for all other inquiries.

"Studies have shown that a patient who has one family physician or one family clinic will get the best continuity of care, we are also proactive in that we contact our patients to remind them of their yearly exams or blood work that may need to happen. This continuity of care helps to prevent medical conditions and can prolong the life of each patient," added Kauchali.

The Apollo Health Centre team is looking forward to the future as they foresee the clinic growing alongside the community. "We are forward-thinking and dedicated to the health and wellness of our patients. We foresee having several multidisciplinary team members join us,

standby and will stand in for Dr. Kauchali while he is away from the clinic attending to patients elsewhere.
